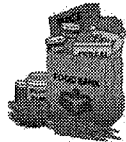

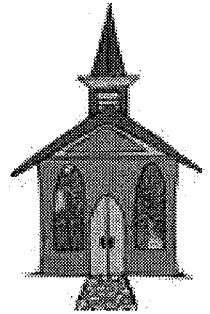

### *Did You Know?*

A red squirrel can travel 24 kilometers an hour (15m/hr) chasing an intruder through treetops because its body is built for treetop travel. Five strong and flexible toes enable it to scramble over even tiny twigs. Its tail acts as a balance when climbing and a rudder when sailing through the air. Its eyes are adapted for viewing vertical (tree-like) objects, which helps it judge the distance between trees. Also it has sensing hairs along its body which allow it to tell a branch from a twig.



A squirrel's winter larder contains cones, nuts, mushrooms, and other foods. Soft foods like mushrooms are stored on branches to dry.

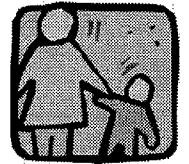

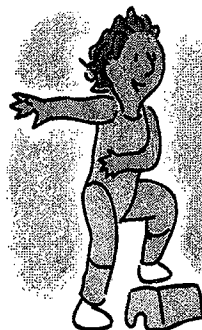

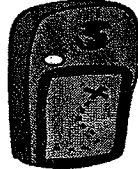
