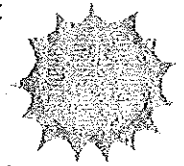

Construction and Demolition (C&D) Debris Sorting Guide

1. Asphalt Shingles
2. Clean Wood: Brush or any wood that has NOT been treated including pallets.
3. Treated wood: painted, timbers, pressure treated, glued, coated, wooden windows & doors
4. Clean (new) Gyproc: not painted or fire retardant
5. Aggregate: rocks, bricks, cement (without rebar) rubble, mortar, asphalt
6. Waste (other) C&D: vinyl, floor coverings, siding, tile, painted gyproc, insulation

Clean Cardboard must be recycled. Caulking tubes, insulation bags and other packaging goes in a clear bag for regular garbage. A good rule of thumb to help classify C&D waste: If it was part of a building it is C&D waste. It can be removed from the structure (ex. Area rug, dressers, chairs) it is not classified as C&D. If you are performing demolition, contact the transfer station for more information. 522-2659.

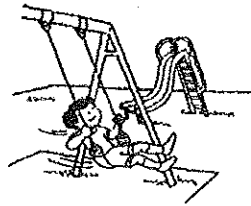

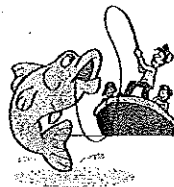

An Introduction to SHOP

SHOP is a newly formed society in the Sherbrooke area that will provide space, programs and a future for the mentally challenged adults of this area. These adults now travel to Guysborough or Antigonish for programs so there is a need to provide access right here at home. The amalgamation of the schools has given us an opportunity to acquire the space that is needed for such a project and we have now embarked on a fundraising campaign to secure the funds that are needed to contribute to the costs of this project. The new community space at the school will also be available to house such programs as Kids First as well as meeting space needs for the general public.

Our fundraising efforts started in April with the sale of 1000 ft. of plastic wrap for \$16, which is going very well. We are selling tickets for the month of June on a propane BBQ and buffet for two at Liscomb Lodge. We'd like to thank Highland Home Hardware and Liscomb Lodge for their support and donations.
