### **NOTE THERE WAS AN ERROR IN AUGUST'S ISSUE A Tribute to George Archibald**

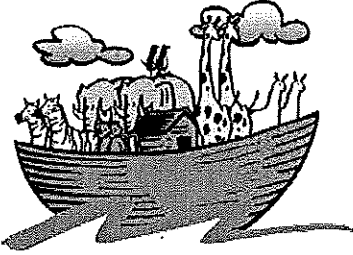
In 1963 two young college students decided to set up a project to protect the Crane population of the world. These two young men, Ronald Sauey of Wisconsin, USA and George Archibald of Sherbrooke, NS called their project "The International Crane Foundation". This project proved to be enormously popular. Sir David Attenborough had this to say about it, "Cranes are international travelers and great ambassadors for conservation, worldwide. What birds could be more deserving of our help and protection? After the project had run for some time Ronald died but so much interest had been aroused in saving cranes that George has been left with a great team of people assisting him in carrying on this worldwide work and now a delightful little paper is published regularly "The Bugle". Anyone making a donation to the I.C.F will receive "The Bugle". On this 14<sup>th</sup> anniversary of I.C.F George was awarded a **\$100,000** cash prize given by the Audubon Society and presented by Dan Lufkin for Environmental Leadership. George immediately donated the \$100,000 to the I.C.F. Also his Excellency Hon. David Johnson, Gov. Gen. of Canada – announced his appointments to the "Order of Canada", one of our countries highest civilian appointments. George was named one of these 56 new appointees. At a ceremony to be held at a later date these recipients will be invited to accept their insignia. Congratulations to George!
