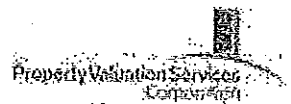

Understanding your Property Assessment Notice



- The front page of your notice shows your property's assessed value, capped assessment (if eligible for the Capped Assessment Program) and taxable assessed value (used to calculate your property taxes).
- The back of the assessment notice includes five years of assessment values for your property.
- In Nova Scotia, property assessments are based on market value sales from two years prior to the current year.

When you receive your assessment notice in January:

- Review the information to ensure you understand your current property assessment.
- If you do not feel that your assessment is a reasonable estimate of market value two years prior to the date of your notice, **you can appeal your assessment within 31 days from the date on your notice.**
