COUNCIL MEETING: The next Regular Meeting of St. Mary's Municipal Council will be held on **Monday, January 11, 2016 at 7pm**, Council Chambers. The public is invited to attend.

The Municipality of St. Mary's is very pleased to announce the receipt of a very generous donation. A gift of **\$100,000** has been graciously given to the St. Mary's RecPlex from The Roy Steed Personal Trust. Mr. Steed has been a supporter of the RecPlex in the past, providing funding to assist in the early stages of the facility.

It is the Municipality's intention to utilize these funds in a manner that will ensure the RecPlex continues to be a staple in the community for physical activity and community events. We will be engaging the public in the New Year, providing you the opportunity to be involved with the planning for continued use of the RecPlex! This process will look at how to best utilize this funding to ensure its long term viability. This unexpected gift is very much appreciated and over the next several weeks the Municipality will develop a plan to recognize Mr. Steed for his contribution to the community.
