****** Following the election on October 15, 2016 the Municipality of the District of Saint Mary's became aware of a number of irregularities that occurred in District 3/5 in the Melrose-Caledonia area.

The Municipality wants to ensure the integrity of the election process and are therefore, in consultation with our legal counsel, requesting that the Courts make a determination on the validity of the election. This will be done through an application to have the election voided under section 158 (2) of the *Municipal Election Act*.

The Municipality appreciates the involvement of all candidates and residents in the democratic process and want to protect the interests of all involved. The application was submitted on October 24th, after which it will be up to the courts to make a decision on the outcome of the application

Eligible youth intern activities include, but are not limited to:

- Projects that enable SMEs to increase the level of innovation, productivity, quality and competitiveness.
- Projects that will enable SMEs to adopt and use ICT to improve their operational effectiveness and increase productivity and competitiveness.
- Projects related to the marketing and development of new markets outside of Atlantic Canada.
