Request for Tenders - Labour to Re-shingle Roof of Sherbrooke Library

The Municipality of the District of St. Mary's is requesting tender prices for labour to shingle/resurface the Sherbrooke Library roof located at 11 Main Street, Sherbrooke. Full tender packages will be available after June 1st, 2017 by contacting the Municipal Office.

Sherbrooke Waterline Replacement Project

The Municipality have recently awarded the contract for Project Management to CBCL Consultants to provide oversight on the waterline replacement project. We will be working with them over the next months to complete surveys and to engage a design consultant to develop the final design and prepare tender specifications and documents. It's anticipated that construction may begin in October 2017.

The project received federal and provincial funding under the Clean Water and Wastewater Fund and will be 75% funded by that program. It will involve replacing water lines, valves and fittings for the east side of the distribution system from intersection at Court Street along Main St, #7 highway, Sonora Rd (Fourth St), Restoration Drive and the Old Road Hill to the end of the distribution line.

Tourism Investment on Eastern Shore (WITAP)

ACOA announced a Government of Canada investment of \$261,000 for Destination Eastern and Northumberland Shores Nova Scotia Association (DEANS). The funding is provided through ACOA's Business Development Program. With this support, DEANS will conduct research on the history, places and culture of the 100 Wild Islands area, a unique gathering of islands that has remained virtually untouched for 10,000 years. It provides one large ecosystem and encompasses a mosaic of every coastal habitat found in Nova Scotia.

The project will facilitate the development of sustainable experiential tourism products, and include workshops to create service offerings in communities between Musquodoboit Harbour and Sherbrooke, as well as the development of a branding framework for the Eastern Shore.
