Municipality of St. Mary's – Did You Know?

(First in a series of information that will be posted periodically in the Municipal Newsletter and on the Website)

Financial:

- The municipality has been working on improving its Financial Condition Indicators (FCI) used by the Nova Scotia Department of Municipal Affairs to monitor the state of municipalities in the province. For Fiscal Year ending March 31, 2017 the municipality had 10 green (low risk) indicators and three yellow (moderate risk) indicators.
- The municipality ended the last two fiscal years with operating surpluses that added \$112,565 to the accumulated surplus. The accumulated surplus at the beginning of fiscal year 2018 / 2019 was \$1,721,192.
- Grants to organizations totaled \$37,000 over the past three years in addition to \$9,000 in scholarships to students and \$56,000 in District Grants.
- The Roy Steed Trust Fund was used to complete improvements at the RecPlex such as rebuilding compressors in 2017/18 and the community enhancement initiative.
- The municipality undertook initiatives that resulted in uncollected taxes being reduced from 28% in 2014 to 9.7% in 2017.
- The municipality's debt service ratio is at 6.5% which is substantially below the 15% target used by Municipal Affairs as a warning level on municipal debt.
- Financial assistance was provided in the form of a \$50,000 grant and loan guarantees to the Sherbrooke
 Area Volunteer Fire Department for the new fire hall.
- The municipality committed to a \$25,000 grant (\$5,000 per year for 5 years) to the St. Marthra's Hospital Fund for regional health care in the area.
- An Audit Committee was formed consisting of the seven councilors and a non-elected resident of the municipality, as per the new Provincial legislation on municipal reporting (Bill 10).

> Infrastructure:

- Dry hydrants were installed in Denver, Liscomb, Ecum Secum, Port Bickerton, Jordanville and Goshen.
- Three projects were completed to replace all waterlines on the Eastside of the Sherbrooke Water System. Total cost of all three projects was over \$2.1 million. Funding in the amount of \$1.4 Million was provided by federal and provincial programs for the projects.
- Repaying of Court Street and sewer improvements were completed in 2016.
- Sherbrooke Library upgrades including flooring, windows, siding and a new roof were completed.
- The Municipality secured funding and engaged Seaside Wireless to install an internet tower and equipment in the Spanish Ship Bay /Liscomb area.

St. Mary's River Paddling Expedition October 6th 2018

Hello folks it's once again time to prepare for our <u>annual paddling event</u>. This year our excursion will take us on the West Branch of the St. Mary's. A beautiful 14 km run starting just above the Foot Bridge Pool off highway 348 in Smithfield. The launch site is at civic address 5132 and I'd like to thank the Connor family for allowing us to access the river through their property. I will mark the driveway with an orange canoe sign similar to the ones marking our existing paddling trails. I would ask that you enter their driveway to unload your boat and park in the space across the road from their property. This is where we will return after the paddle to pick up your vehicle. Same as last year, if you require a drive back up river after the paddle I will ensure you get back to your vehicle one way or another.

We will be leaving the shore from the Connor cabin at 10:00 am and I would recommend being there for 9:00 am to insure you are unloaded, packed and boat in the water. Last year we had 40 boats in the water so we will have to be efficient unloading and getting our vehicles out of the Connor driveway to the parking location.

We will need at least two feet of water on our data logger for the paddle. You can keep an eye on this via our webpage at https://www.stmarysriverassociation.com/water-conditions.html. If we don't have the necessary water level we will cancel the event. Click on the West River link to view a live feed of our logger level. You will all be required to fill out a release form before we leave the launch site. Please bring your canoe or kayak, life jackets, paddles, snacks, sunscreen and drinking water. If you would like to attend, but don't have the equipment, the Recreation Department at the St. Mary's Municipal office has four kayaks available for rent which come with a paddle, life jacket, and safety kit. Please contact them for more details.

We will be stopping along the route at some interesting sites including Rock Island Pool, Churn Brook waterfalls, an old lead mine and our data logger site. Our exit point will be at the Crow's Nest also known as the Bells of St. Mary's cabin. If you are going to leave a vehicle here please allow yourself a half hour of travel time to get to the Connor launch site. Keep in mind there is no cell coverage heading up the West Branch and it will probably be lost around the Hattie Road area.

Rain or shine we plan to be on the water. I hope to see you all there for a fun filled great adventure!
