### Provincial Property Tax Rebate for Seniors

This program, administered by Service Nova Scotia on behalf of the Department of Community Services, is designed to help eligible seniors remain in their homes by providing them with an annual rebate on their municipal property taxes.

This program provides eligible homeowners with a 50% rebate of the actual residential municipal property taxes paid in the previous year, up to a maximum of \$800/year.

To be eligible to receive this rebate you must have been receiving the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) or The Allowance in January 2018 and you must also have your previous year's property taxes paid in full.

### Application for Residential Low Income Property Tax Exemption

The Municipality of the District of St. Mary's provides assistance to homeowners to help pay their residential property taxes. Qualified applicants will receive a credit which is applied directly to the tax account. To qualify you must be a Canadian citizen and permanent resident of St. Mary's Municipality and own the assessed property and occupy it as your home with the prior year's property taxes paid in full.

# Municipal News

## What is a Dangerous & Unsightly Property?

Dangerous or unsightly refers to a property or building that is partly demolished, decayed, deteriorated or in a state of disrepair that has the potential to be dangerous, unsightly or unhealthy, and includes:

### Properties, Buildings or Structures that are:

- In ruinous or dilapidated condition
- In a condition with depreciates the value of land or buildings in the vicinity
- In such a state of non-repair as to be no longer suitable for human habitation or business purposes
- An allurements to children who may play there to their danger
- A hazard to the health or safety of the public
- Unsightly in relation to neighboring properties because the exterior finish of the building or structure is not maintained
- A fire hazard to itself or to surrounding lands or buildings
- Excavated or had fill placed on it in a manner that results in a hazard

### Properties that Contain:

- Junk
- Cleaning of yards or other rubbish or waste
- Abandoned vehicles, equipment or machinery
- Wood shavings
- Paper
- Sawdust
- Dry and inflammable grass or weeds
- Other combustible material
- Materials or waste that are stockpiled or hidden

If a property is deemed dangerous or unsightly by the Municipality's building inspector, the property owner will be notified and asked to clean up the property within a specific timeframe. If the owner does not comply, the Municipality can take appropriate action and charge any expenses to the owner's tax account.

## Construction and Demolition Materials (C&D)

Did you know our transfer station accepts construction and demolition materials? If you are tearing down a building or just cleaning up old materials in the yard, some of those materials are considered C&D. The below chart outlines what C&D materials are accepted at the Transfer Station and what materials are not.

### Acceptable C&D Waste:

- Concrete & brick
- Grubbing & brush
- Clean soil & rock
- Wood ceiling treated & untreated
- Siding, tile, gyproc & insulation
- Solid roofing materials
- Glass, vinyl window casings
- Carpets, floor coverings
- Asphalt

### Not Acceptable C&D Waste:

- Drywall compound boxes or pails
  - Insulation bags, cans, drums or other packages
  - Roofing adhesives
  - Tars
  - Waterproofing compounds
  - Roofing product packaging
  - Metals
  - Light ballast
  - Fluorescent light tubes
  - High intensity discharge lights
  - Mercury thermostats
  - Cushion flooring/linoleum
- These materials must be separated into recycling, garbage, or household hazardous waste

### Community Profile: Jeff Burns

Crossing the Northumberland Strait from New Brunswick to Prince Edward Island may seem like an annual activity that has become mundane to the average traveller, but imagine doing it by water and being powered only by your own arms and legs.

That is the challenge that St. Mary's River resident Jeff Burns has taken on. Jeff is set to do 'The BIG SWIM' on August 18<sup>th</sup> alongside his kayaker Mandy Osmond of Newfoundland, all in the name of Brigadoon Village. Brigadoon Village is located in Aylesford, Nova Scotia and offers programming to Atlantic Canadian children and youth living with chronic health conditions or other life challenges.

Jeff will be one of 50 swimmers paired with their kayakers and under the close watch of patrol vessels taking on this extreme challenge and he couldn't be more excited. "Swimming is something that has come natural to me since I was a child and I have passed it on to my two kids. Since it costs roughly \$1300 to send a child to camp for a week, my goal is to raise \$2600, sending two deserving kids to camp," says Jeff.

Currently well on his way to his goal, Jeff has raised \$1755 to date and has swum over 200km so far in preparation.

  - NO Pre-treated cardboard such as waxed cardboard.
3. Everyone must be in a boat, no swimmers or pulling/pushing boats from the water
  4. Decorations are allowed and encouraged provided they are not used as structural or floatation elements.
  5. Crew costumes are encouraged.
  6. Design is left to builder(s). Let your imagination take over
  7. Your boat must be propelled by canoe paddles. The crew compartment CANNOT be enclosed so as to interfere with escape.

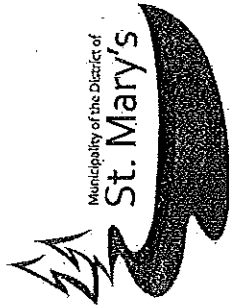
