Municipal News

Municipal Notification Service

The Municipality is pleased to announce it has implemented the Voyent Alert Notification service to keep residents informed during times of crisis and for day-to-day notices. This notification service will help to connect residents to important information relating to council, local emergency services, last minute cancellations as well as water utility maintenance/disruptions. Notifications can be sent to a landline, cellphone, or email. You can self-register at **register.voyent-alert.com** and choose what type of notifications you would like to receive or by calling the Municipal Office at 902-522-2049.



2021/2022 Property Tax Bills

Property tax bills for the 2021/2022 fiscal year have been mailed out and are due by July 31st, 2021. There are several ways to make payments on your municipal tax account which you can find listed on the back of your tax bill.

Provincial Property Tax Rebate for Seniors

This program, administered by Service Nova Scotia on behalf of the Department of Community Services, is designed to help eligible seniors remain in their homes by providing them with an annual rebate on their municipal property taxes. This program provides eligible homeowners with a 50% rebate of the actual residential municipal property taxes paid in the previous year, up to a maximum of \$800/year. To be eligible to receive this rebate you must have been receiving the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) or The Allowance and you must also have your previous year's property taxes paid in full. Provincial Property Tax Rebate should be available in early July.

Municipal Residential Low Income Property Tax Exemption

The Municipality of the District of St. Mary's provides assistance to homeowners to help pay their residential property taxes. Qualified applicants will receive a credit which is applied directly to the tax account. To qualify you must be a Canadian citizen and permanent resident of St. Mary's Municipality. Your income must be \$21,500 or less, own the assessed property and occupy it as your home with the prior year's property taxes paid in full. Climate Change Plan for Clean Growth- Public Engagement

Environment and Climate Change has launched a 60-day public engagement on creating goals under the Sustainable Development Goals Act and a new Climate Change Plan for Clean Growth. The engagement runs from May 27 to July 26, 2021. They are interested in hearing individuals' ideas, visions, and are committed to having those voices help form the direction for government. Their team is making a concerted effort to reach out to as many people as possible through a variety of avenues. They have partnered with the Clean Foundation to help coordinate the engagement process. There are several ways to engage, including public Zoom sessions, a do-it-yourself kit for groups and communities to facilitate their own discussions, as well as email, mail, and phone submissions. Guysborough County Housing Network- Employment Opportunity:

The Guysborough County Housing Network was formed in 2019 to explore housing needs in Guysborough County. Our network is comprised of private citizens, service providers from community and government, representatives from Municipal government, not-for-profit organizations. We are supported by program staff from St. FX University Extension Department and researchers from Cape Breton University.
