## Meetings of Council

The next regular meeting of Council is Monday, May 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022 at 4:00pm. Committee of the Whole meetings for May are scheduled for Wednesday, May 4<sup>th</sup> & 18<sup>th</sup> at 4:00pm. ## 2022-2023 Municipal Approved Budget

On April 6<sup>th</sup>, 2022 St. Mary's Municipal Council approved the Municipal Operating and Capital Budgets for 2022-23 and set the tax rates. The total operating budget is \$3,462,824, a 5.08% increase over last year's budget. The tax rate will remain the same as last year, at \$0.95 for residential/resource assessed properties and \$2.26 for commercial assessed properties.
