Voyent Alert

Voyent Alert is a notification system that shares important information with residents during emergencies, such as fire bans, water advisories, or extreme weather, as well as for everyday updates like recreation cancellations or water utility notices. Notifications are sent through multiple channels, including a mobile app, email, text, and phone calls, and can include maps, images, or attachments to provide context. Recycling Program

St. Mary's recycling program is now managed by Circular Materials, a non-profit organization working to make recycling in Nova Scotia easier and more effective. Curbside collection will continue as usual, and you can now recycle more items than ever before, including hot and cold beverage cups, deodorant and toothpaste tubes, frozen juice containers, and ice cream tubs. EMO Safety Tips: Freezing Rain and Ice

Before a storm, prepare your home or a safe place to stay, monitor weather updates, and plan for possible power outages. Keep an emergency kit stocked with water, food, medications, and pet supplies, and charge phones and power banks. If possible, fill fuel tanks in advance. During and after icy conditions, stay indoors, avoid driving, bring pets inside, and ensure livestock have shelter and water. Watch for fallen branches or debris, never touch downed power lines, and follow updates on TV, radio, or social media. If the power goes out, turn off appliances, leave one light on, use battery-powered lighting, check on neighbours and vulnerable individuals, and never use BBQs, camping stoves, or fuel-powered heaters indoors.

Secondary and Backyard Suite Incentive Program

Apply for funding to build a secondary or backyard suite on your property. Funding is available for up to 50% of eligible project costs, to a maximum of \$40,000. The applicant needs to have equity or be approved for financing to cover the total cost of the project (applicant covers all project costs in advance). This program helps homeowners create supportive housing for family members or affordable housing for tenants on their property. Homeowners can apply for a forgivable loan to build a secondary or backyard suite on the property of their principal residence.
