Warden's Message

So many things to talk about, so little space. Here it goes;

Trash Collection: June brings us to weekly trash collection (recycling and bulky items remain on opposite weeks.) Please, please, please cover your trash with something when placing it out. I saw crows picking at some uncovered bags on my way to the office this morning and that not only makes a mess, but raises a health risk depending on what's in them.

Drought Conditions: As you may have read or heard, the prediction for this summer is dry and hot again. Even with all the rain we seemed to have had, water levels are not fully recovered to their former status. As you also may have heard, the province will no longer be subsidizing drinking water. This will obviously put many of us in a potentially difficult situation. Please consider stocking up on drinking water early for your family's health. Also you might want to check on the municipality's website for available options for water delivery.

Prescription Delivery Service and Pharmacy Update

The Municipality was notified on May 19th, 2026, that Shoppers Drug Mart has decided that pharmacy services from the temporary facility will end on June 11th, 2026. Shoppers has advised that prescriptions can be transferred to your pharmacy of choice up to June 11th, after June 11th prescriptions and health records will be transferred to Shoppers Drug Mart #143 Antigonish (303 Main Street [902-863-6522](tel:902-863-6522)).

To help reduce travel requirements for residents, **Superstore Pharmacy #309 Antigonish** has arranged for prescriptions filled through their pharmacy to be available for pickup at the **Sherbrooke Public Library, 11 Main Street**, at a set time weekly, beginning the week of June 22, 2026. The service is anticipated to operate once weekly initially, with the potential for additional pickup days/times depending on community interest. The Sherbrooke Public Library is pleased to be hosting this important community service. To transfer prescriptions to superstore Pharmacy #309 and arrange delivery call [902-863-4046](tel:902-863-4046).

Since the closure of the previous pharmacy location, the Municipality has worked to support the continuity of pharmacy services by providing municipal space for the temporary facility and by initiating a transparent, province-wide procurement process aimed at securing long-term pharmacy services within the municipality through private sector development.

The Municipality recognizes the importance of pharmacy services to residents and the significant impact this announcement will have on the community. The Municipality remains committed to supporting a fair and open process to encourage long-term pharmacy services within the municipality. **June 5th, 2026, is the deadline for inquiries** in response to the municipality's expression of interest for pharmacy services. **The submission deadline is 4:00 p.m., June 19th, 2026.** Potential developers and pharmacy operators may direct inquiries and submissions to procurement@saint-marys.ca.
