

PUBLIC NOTICE: VOLUNTARY WATER CONSERVATION ORDER

Effective October 28, 2025, at 4:00pm

With recent rainfall and increased reservoir levels, the Sherbrooke Water Utility is now able to ease restrictions. As a result, the mandatory conservation order will be lifted, and a voluntary conservation order is now in place.

The following activities are encouraged for anyone connected to the Sherbrooke Water Utility:

- **Check for leaks and repair them promptly.**
- **Take shorter showers and run full loads in dishwashers/laundry.**

Enforcement: The Municipality will enforce these measures. Even under voluntary conservation, wasteful or unreasonable use of water remains prohibited, as outlined in the [Nova Scotia Utility & Review Board Regulations](#)

These conservation measures will remain in effect until Sherbrooke Lake's water level returns to a reasonable level. Should drought conditions worsen or supplies decline, mandatory conservation measures may be reinstated.
