Commercial Disposal of Creosote at Transfer Station

Policy:

The Municipality can, In accordance with approval from Nova Scotia Department of Environment, bury Construction and Demolition materials containing creosote on site at the Municipal Transfer Station.

The current Transfer Station scales have the capacity to measure only up to a total length of 20 feet therefore restricting the Municipality's ability to charge based on weight for materials dropped off.

Acceptance:

- Commercial quantities of creosote materials will be accepted at the Municipal Transfer Station.
- Truck Drivers must check in with the Transfer Station attendant upon arrival with creosote material for disposal
- A material acceptance slip will be signed by the driver and the attendant. The slip includes the following information; Date, time, Truck #, license plate number, driver's name, company name and address.
- The Driver will dump the material in an orderly manner at the location designated by the attendant

Rates:

B-Train Truck = \$2,000 per truck load

Semi-Trailer = \$1,000 per truck load

Dump Truck = \$625 per truck load

Payment:

- The Municipality will collect the Material Acceptance Slips and invoice monthly
- Net 30 days payment on all invoices and interest of 1.16% per month will be charged on overdue accounts.
